1. PDLN at IFRRO's Annual General Meeting 2010 in Boston

PDLN's Excecutive Board Members Sandra Chastanet and Andrew Hughes have attended IFRRO's 39th Annual General Meeting in Boston, Massachusetts, 25-28 October.

Sandra Chastanet of the Centre Français d'exploitation du Droit de Copie (CFC) has held a presentation on PDLN at the meeting on October 26th.

2. PDLN-Connect

PDLN-Connect is enabling the exchange of database content between partners. Being fully compliant with copyright regulations it eases the work of customers (only one contract has to be signed with the local provider!) and extends the coverage of international press at their disposal.

PDLN-Connect is making progress!

German PMG and Belgian Press Banking are the first PDLN members applying the PDLN-Connect standard on a binational level. The service is running successfully and without complications. The gateway has also been implemented by Mediargus and APA-Defacto. An agreement has also been signed between Press Banking and APA-Defacto.

How does it work? Version 1.0

Practically, PDLN-Connect allows a customer of two or more partners to read and work with contents from those partners on one single platform of his choice: from there, he is able to seamlessly read articles from other partner databases that match his search criteria. The current version 1 is limited to stored searches, i.e. search criteria that have been defined and stored beforehand on the database of each concerned partner.

PDLN-Connect (2)

Content is transferred only when needed, thus avoiding costly content replication and allowing better distribution control for the right holders.

PDLN-Connect is implemented using Web Services and the SOAP protocol, which is a well-known and accepted standard in the industry, vendor-independent. Technically, the database or platform of reference (i.e. the platform of choice of a given customer) makes requests using this protocol to the remote platform (i.e. the platform of the partner from which content is to be retrieved) and this remote platform returns results

In order to implement the exchange of content, the following operations are provided in Version 1:

- create a link on both platforms between existing identifiers (logins) that belong to the same customer
- get a list of existing stored searches for a given customer
- get the result list of a stored search on a given date (list of references to content that matches the stored search)
- fetch a piece of content in a given format (currently text or pdf), from its reference in the above result list

PDLN-Connect (3)

This scheme can easily be extended to more than two partners, each partner communicating in parallel with all other concerned partners. The way results and contents are handled and presented is deliberately not part of PDLN-Connect, which allows every partner to tailor the content usage to its needs and business model, of course in respect of copyright regulations.

How are we going on? PDLN-Connect, Version 2.0

From practical experience gathered in the field by Press Banking, Mediargus, PMG and APA, several enhancements to the current version have been proposed, analysed and discussed. It is clear that customers want to be able to search multiple databases online, with direct searches. This functionality is foreseen in Version 2.0 of PDLN-Connect. PDLN's Technical Working Group is drawing the V. 2.0 standard specifications since summer. There have been several meetings. The target is to have the standard approved by the Board Meeting on December 1st.

PDF Processing Seminar

Preview: Many of us are serving PDF content, clipped in a variety of ways; - by users, by technology, or by hand - outsourced or otherwise, or created from text streams. The clipping process is a crucial and expensive component of services, in NLA's case representing over 15% of the total eClips production cost. NLA want to drive down these costs, and have spent some time investigating options, including better technology, better publisher feeds, alternative PCA services, and cheaper outsourcing.

4. Rights Direct

The US copyright collection organization CCC has launched a European subsidiary in September called "Rights Direct". Rights Direct aims to sell global licenses to multinational companies.

For your information PDLN's vice president Andrew Hughes has written a note on this important issue.

1. The US copyright collection organisation CCC is starting a European sales operation Rights Direct to sell global licences to multinational companies. To support this they are seeking agreements with European publishers, including newspaper publishers, as well as leveraging their bilateral digital agreements with RROs where these cover digital rights (paper rights are not very relevant to this development).

2. The sales focus is on multinational companies, especially those with strong STM bias, and the rights are not focused on media monitoring or press cuttings agencies (as with CCC US services). p.t.o. >>

CCC say their users are demanding this. Given the complexity of securing case by case deals from national RROs, and our own experience with EC and others, this is credible;- especially for US based businesses.

3. If CCC secure (or already hold) relevant agreements for European newspaper content the impact on the press business of PDLN members will vary and is hard to predict. The worst case is Rights Direct is successful in creaming off larger businesses (where most revenue is concentrated) and sells at a lower fee than CCC, making both DLOs and publishers worse off. There is scope for considerable confusion for users when approached by a new RRO, and this could damage the market. The best case is CCC take incremental business from large companies who simply don't take licences because of the diversity of agreements.

4. In any event the development will put pressure on RROs to create better multi-territory agreements. The RRO offering to international companies and international publishers will need to be improved. p.t.o. >>

Similarly PDLN has a role in creating better offerings covering press material. We can probably assume the user need in this case is occasional digital copying, not press reviews.

5. As RROs and CCC will be competing for publishers, RROs will be interested to create a credible offering in US domestic market. This may help create momentum for the creation of a US press centred database and licensing operation.

6. We should assume EC will favour the creation of competition in the RRO market, and in general that competition will be seen as welcome by many users in the market.

7. PDLN role. PDLN should keep its members informed of developments so they can make rational choices and give their publishers good quality advice on the options available to them. PDLN should not assume a policy position on the matter other than providing information.
